Annual Meeting Minutes

President Lee Boergadine called the January 13, 2009 meeting to order at 7:55 PM following the Dessert and Coffee Reception compliments of CT Services. Lee announced the presence of a quorum and introduced the Board of Directors with a brief synopsis of each responsibility: Gary Bannister, Al Kent, Cheryl Bolland, Kappie Swanson, Jennifer Weaver, Marlene Deck, Tom Stefancic, Cyndi Miller and himself. Lee also introduced Manager Connie Schultz from PSI, John Bickley our attorney and our PSI Office Manager Nicki Leroy.

A motion was made by Laura Fulton and seconded by Bill Gain to approve the minutes from the January 2008 annual meeting. Minutes were approved by verbal affirmation.

A call for additional nominations for Board positions from the floor was announced by Lee. There being no additional nominations, a motion was made by Jim Miller and seconded by Len Dreas to close the nominations.

PRESIDENT'S COMMENTS

President Lee welcomed all present and thanked the residents for taking the time to attend the meeting. He expressed his thanks to PSI for their professionalism. Lee related that this board is one of the best he has ever had the privilege of working with even though he had no idea what he was getting himself into. The responsibilities of each board member were taken seriously which has resulted in an outstanding year. He related a few of the accomplishments with the promise of more to come from each board member: Renovations to the office building which has resulted in the

increased usage by the board, sub-associations and adult activity smaller groups, renovations to the Cheshire Club, including new floor coverings, which are nearing completion. Pool and Safety Committee installed a new ID card system replacing the obsolete "tag" system. The security camera system was also expanded from 3 cameras to 8 cameras and the quality of the images has also been improved. New tennis courts on Merrill New Road have been a great enhancement for our community. The Adult and Youth Activities committee was active this year hosting luncheons, game nights, holiday parties for the children and the adults.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Gary Bannister reviewed and explained the 2008 results (the numbers are through the end of November). He related that the increase in assessments were based on the 5.6% Consumer Price Index. The CPI does not have the oil based products and wire that have increased 20%. There are 2 major projects for 2009 - \$300K for the street replacements and \$200K for Phase II of the street lights. Our reserves are healthy. The actual budget is not in the packet tonight it was sent out with the November newsletter to be in compliance with the time necessary for the residents to review. (Next year there will be a note on the ballot to this effect.) Gary also mentioned that the Board has never come to the residents for an emergency assessment. He also reminded all that the Waste Management money is a pass through figure. He also explained that we only have 12 serious

delinquencies, one of which is in court. This is only 2 to 3 percent of the total.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Architectural Standards Cyndi Miller reported that the year of 2008 was moderately busy with architectural applications and requests. There were a total of 15 requests and all were approved. Some of the projects included a new home to be built, various re-siding projects, new decks, new driveway and a new exterior finish project. All the projects were built in accordance with our guidelines and standards insuring design compatibility and aesthetic desirability. It has been a pleasure to serve with the 2008 Board of Directors and admire the time and dedication that has been generously given.

Maintenance – Al Kent reported on the following:

Landscaping

Ground Pros, contracted late in their scheduling season, did a better job than the previous contractor. The lawn mowing and trimming were accomplished with minimal prompting. The amount of oversight and callbacks were minimal for a company's first year. Ground Pros had two to three levels of management inspecting the property each week. However, there is a considerable amount of work to be done, which was never undertaken in the past, in order to bring the appearance up to our standards. They were unable to tackle all of it this year and will complete more next year, if we sign another contract.

Beautification Committee

A year ago, at this meeting I announced Sandy Andry had agreed to chair the Beautification Committee. For 12 months now, everyone has seen the difference Sandy and her Committee have made in our environment. The Christmas decorations turned into winter decorations after the holiday season passed. In the spring, there were special plantings in the Common area, which evolved into summer plantings. This was accompanied by the many common and mailbox areas, the committee planted and maintained all summer with watering, weeding and deadheading. Some individuals caring for their areas refreshed them periodically, with new plants. In the fall, mums were used extensively in the Common. Ground Pros liked the

plantings so much they took a picture of the sign and part of the area in front of the pool house and posted it in their gallery on their website. It can be viewed at

Merrill New Road Park and Island

As one job leads to another, building new tennis courts led to re-landscaping the park and the island. Some of the major components have been completed, but not all. Several trees and many shrubs have been added to the park during this process.

A stone sign like the one in the Common has to be erected and a major portion of the grassy area will be naturalized. The naturalization will take three to five years. In the end, it will be a beautiful area, requiring minimum maintenance and little mowing.

When both areas are completed, major work should not be required for 40 years.

Lakes

Lake Prestbury

Although Integrated Lakes Management, Inc. had done minimal work the previous year, this was the first year they had a contact to manage

the entire shoreline. In the late winter, they removed a number of young "junk" trees. In the spring a burn was conducted on the areas that weren't part of the 319 Project, followed by seeding of those areas including the island. Midsummer, Integrated Lakes Management removed 32 cubic yards of thistles and herbicided the stems. Later in the fall there was another herbicide application in the same areas as seeds had germinated and would become next year's thistle crop. The cattails, an undesirable plant, in the wetlands were herbicided.

Whereas it is recognized, it will take several years to bring the thistles under control and many more to eliminate them, Integrated Lakes' efforts were far less than what is acceptable. The time to herbicide the thistles was in the spring when the plants were young, not when they were mature and going to seed. Integrated Lakes has reorganized with a separate division for shorelines and naturalization of areas. We have signed on for another year and expected to see better results in 2009.

Lake Blackberry

Significant time and money was put into the weed problem on the Lake Blackberry Shoreline. Thistles and willows were cut, removed and herbicided. This work is purely a band-aid until funds are available to naturalize the shoreline like Lake Prestbury.

As I finish, I want to say kudos to the sub-associations who enthusiastically supported the idea of decorating their signs for Christmas in the same manner as Prestbury. Not only did the signs look festive, the decorations were uniform throughout the Community. We looked like the one association that we actually are.

I also want to thank the Board. This Board has a great spirit of cooperation – a sense of give and take so that in time, funding is available and everyone can tend to their areas of responsibility. Special thanks to Tom Stefancic. We've worked side by side, consulting one another, on nearly every project. And special thanks to Gary Bannister. Gary has been very

generous with his time, attending many small meetings, helping us work our projects into the overall budget.

The following is the list of 2008 Maintenance Activities:

- ✓ Ground Pros was contracted as the new landscaping company replacing Alan Horticultural Enterprises
- ✓ Merrill New Road Park was enclosed with split-rail fencing to delineate PCA property
- ✓ Re-landscaped the northern and southern areas of Merrill New Road Park according to the Master Plan and restored the privacy for residents of Laura Lane.
- ✓ Re-landscaped the island in Merrill New Road according to the Master Plan.
- ✓ Let and accepted bids for naturalization of a large part of Merrill New Road Park
- ✓ Replaced deteriorated sidewalk across the pool house to the end of the office with a brick walkway matching that of the clubhouse area
- ✓ Landscaped rear of office building and installed a shade garden on the east end of the clubhouse
- ✓ Installed up-lighting and moon-lighting in the park at the west side of office building

- ✓ Installed 538 plant plugs on the east and west banks of the outfall of Lake Prestbury
- ✓ Conducted burn on north bank of Lake Prestbury from the office to Winthrop New Road Park.
- ✓ Sprayed and removed 32 cubic yards of thistles from Lake Prestbury Shoreline
- ✓ Sprayed and removed thistles and willows from Lake Blackberry Shoreline
- ✓ Worked with and supported Sandy Andry Beautification Chair, and the Committee on design and seasonal plantings for the Common and common areas
- ✓ Procured four new agate trash collection containers with closed lids and two cigarette butt containers
- ✓ Coordinated Christmas decorations with sub-associations with signs for uniformity and consistency

This concludes my report.

Tennis and Streets/Street Lights -

Tennis - Tom reported that he is currently in contact with Jessie Laffey for a junior program with an announcement in the near future.

Streets – Tom and Al will be meeting with the township to confirm commitment of funds for street

renovation along Hanks Road and Buckingham Road. Street renovations for 2009 are also in the process of being reviewed. Bidding typically starts in march for an early start to finish by summer.

Street Lights – Street light replacements with the exception of some of the damaged poles are complete for this phase. The contractor will be returning in spring for clean-up and replacement.

Security

Neighborhood Watch continues to be a very valuable source in our community for security issues. A BIG Thank You goes to Tina deChaud and Wendy Hirsch for their leadership of this program.

We have worked diligently with ADS to make sure that we have adequate security camera

coverage for areas around the pool, office building and clubhouse. We have also updated with ADS our monitoring of the fire and smoke alarms in the clubhouse and office building and burglar alarm in the office building.

We have expressed our concern several times this past year to the Sugar Grove Police Department and the Kane County Sheriff's Department regarding speeding on Hanks Road.

Pool

We received many positive comments regarding the operation of the pool this past summer. The Card Smart Prestbury ID cards were issued to over 400 households and will be used in 2009 for admittance to the pool area and also for other activities within our development. We have hired Chicagoland Pool to manage the pool again in 2009. I will be meeting with Dave from Chicagoland Pool before the season begins to go over rules and regulations. I will also meet with a group of residents before the season begins to get suggestions for any changes that they think should be made to rules for the pool. A larger bulletin board was purchased for outside the entrance to the pool to give us room for the posting of announcements regarding activities within the community.

We began leaving security lights on in the pool area all night to aid in security for the area.

I am planning on replacing many of the orange lounge chairs this season as most of them have seen better days and are beyond repair.

Prestbury Citizens Association – A review of 2008

Summary Report 2008

- Attached a summary of our operating & reserve spending to the end of November 2008 with estimates for December 08. Final accounts are being audited and will not be available until March 2009.
- Highlights for capital spend (See explanations capital).
- Our operating expenditures are at or just under our planned figure of 1184.2 K at 1153.5 K which is a small variance from plan of 30.7K (Estimated). We are estimating a small surplus to take to reserves of 62.7 K (Estimated).
- Our Replacement Reserve carried forward to 2009 is estimated to be \$392.7 K
- Finally, our delinquents which represents the number of people who are late in paying their PCA monthly dues, or have defaulted altogether, i.e., over 90 days & greater than \$400.00 stands at 13 out of a total of 900 units at a value of \$32.2 K; \$15 k of this is due to one defaulter who has been in court for two years. Total defaulters are 35 over \$100.00, or 3.8% of the total number of units.

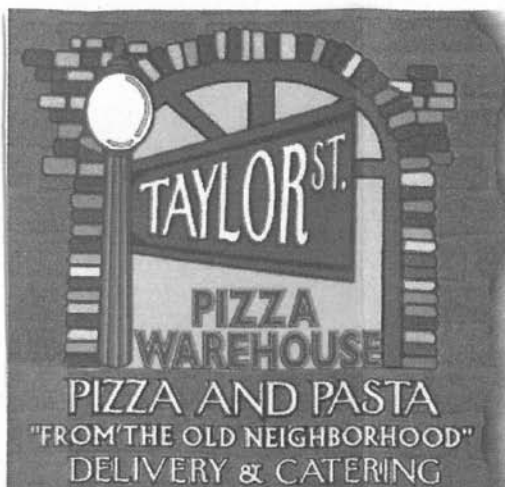
