Coming in 2027 – Assessment Statement Changes

Beginning in 2027, the Prestbury Citizens Association will be implementing a new assessment billing process designed to reduce Association expenses and improve operating efficiency. As part of this change, Annual coupon books will no longer be automatically mailed to owners unless requested.

Instead, homeowners will receive one annual statement at the beginning of each year outlining their assessment amount and payment information.

Homeowners will continue to have several convenient payment options available, including ACH Direct Debit, TownSq, bank Bill Pay, or mailing a check.

Additional details, payment instructions, enrollment information, and important deadlines will be distributed to homeowners in the coming months to ensure everyone has ample time to prepare before the new process takes effect.

SEPTEMBER 2026 PRESTBURY CITIZENS ASSOCIATION MEETING MINUTES

BOARD QUORUM WAS ESTABLISHED – Charles Bohmer, Marlene Deck, Nick Edyvane, Laura Fulton, Dianne Hurrell, Mark Miller. (Board Quorum established.)

Also in attendance: Anne Goebel, Community Manager – Associa Chicagoland and Sara Vasicek, Prestbury Office Assistant

HOMEOWNER ATTENDANCE – 7 in person

COMMUNITY COMMENTS – The meeting started at 6:31 p.m. with the opportunity for community comments:

A resident from Walnut Circle wanted to discuss the landscaping changes that were made to the dogbone parking this year and inquire if it can be changed or updated so that vehicles parked there are better blocked from view. Marlene Deck shared that the changes were made because the bushes planted there previously were dying off due to winter salt and that landscaping throughout the subdivision is reviewed each year. Possible updates to this area will be considered and the resident offered to research plants that might do well there.

A resident of Windwood Court wanted to further address concerns shared via email regarding a person who is parking in the greenspace near Blackberry Lake in order to go fishing. The Board is considering placing a fence with a locked chain in that space, similar to what was done at Beta Lake. Because this area is also used as a boat launch, there are additional considerations. The Board will discuss further.

Another resident inquired about the engineering firms that are being interviewed and whether dredging Prestbury Lake will be on the list of items for them to address. Mark Miller confirmed that this is one of the many areas that will be addressed by the new firm when it is chosen. The Board shared that there was a study done on the lake less than two years ago which concluded that dredging is not an immediate priority.

CALL TO ORDER – Marlene Deck called the meeting to order at 6:47 p.m.

APPROVAL OF AGENDA – Charles Bohmer motioned to approve the revised meeting agenda; Laura Fulton seconded and the motion carried.

APPROVAL OF August 11, 2026 MINUTES – Laura Fulton moved to approve the minutes of the August 11, 2026 board meeting; Mark Miller seconded and the motion carried.

PRESIDENT COMMENTS – It's beginning to feel like fall and Prestbury is so attractive in this season as leaves turn and the sounds and smells of fall fill the air.

We have received reports again of speeding on Winthrop New Road. Please use caution and obey the speed limit on our roads for the safety of all our residents.

I want to remind everyone again to lock their cars when they are parked outside. Vandalism occurred recently when cars were left unlocked and the perpetrators were stopped just in time before they entered a home. Overall Prestbury is a safe community but we must all be vigilant and report any suspicious activity. It is better to be safe than sorry. Maybe it is time that we reactivate our Neighborhood Watch program. If anyone has interest in organizing this program please contact me at president@prestbury.org.

As mentioned in another report this month there will be several board positions that will be open. I encourage residents to consider running for a board position. Meetings are once a month on the second Tuesday. It is important that candidates be available to attend these meetings.

TREASURER REPORT – August Financials – August financials are not yet ready; Laura Fulton will forward to the Board when available.

2027 Budget Preparation – Laura Fulton sent all board members budget information for 2027. Laura and Anne Goebel plan to meet on September 22 to discuss the 2027 budget.

Write Offs – Laura Fulton reviewed the Delinquency and Credit report and shared that there are 6 accounts that have been settled and closed for a total of \$511.62, 9 accounts that owe less than \$10 that are 120 days past due for a total of \$21.78, and 75 credit balances that represent settled accounts for a total of (\$9,362.39) - 67 of those accounts were on a list that the board previously approved to be removed. The net impact is a credit of (\$8828.99) and Laura moved to approve this adjustment; Dianne Hurrell seconded and the motion carried.

Grass clippings and yard waste must be placed in appropriate brown paper bags.

Neither garbage nor yard waste may be placed on curbs prior to 5:00 p.m. on the evening preceding the day of garbage pick-up. All rubbish, trash or garbage shall be kept so as not to be seen from neighboring dwellings and or kept in the garage.

LRS asks that brush and tree trimmings must be bundled and securely tied with twine or string not to exceed 4 feet in length, 2 feet in diameter and 50 –pounds in weight. Individual branches contained in a bundle shall not exceed 4 inches in diameter.

Architectural Standards:

Applications must be filled out and approved prior to any exterior projects.

Parkway Trees: The recommended height for the LRS trucks to drive under without hitting a branch and causing damage must be at least 15 feet high above the street. Single family homeowners per the by-laws maintain the parkway trees.

Commercial Vehicles:

Commercial vehicles may not be parked in Prestbury, except for vehicles belonging to purveyors who are performing a service at a home.

Homeowners who have commercial vehicles, please park in the garage or alternat location away from Prestbury.

MAINTENANCE – LAKES, TREES, LAWNS, PEST CONTROL, BEAUTIFICATION –

STREETS, SEWER, SNOW REMOVAL, STREET LIGHTS, WASTE REMOVAL –

Street Paving:

- M&J Asphalt Paving has been selected by the Board to complete the specific paving projects in the immediate future.
- These projects entail mainly parking areas and represent the last chapter of our previous Paving Planning cycle. The parking lots include Hanks Park, Bury Court and North Buckingham Drive, as well as the entirety of Heaton Court.
- A schedule will be published on the website soon and it is expected that this limited paving should be able to be completed within two to three days of commencement. Thank you for your patience during this period.
- Separately, if you have your own asphalt paving project planned for your house, remember that asphalt plants generally cease seasonal operations in late November, and that residential concrete flatwork, while never stopping completely, slows around the same time; plan accordingly.

Streets/Lights/Infrastructure:

- The process of soliciting new engineering firms for Road and Infrastructure projects in the future is now in the final stage with our Special Board Meeting scheduled for **September 15th commencing at Noon**, in the Cheshire Clubhouse.
- Our three candidate firms will present to the Board and Community - HR Green; Trotter & Associates; and, Cage Civil Engineering, in that order. I highly encourage you to attend, listen intently and ask insightful questions.
- In that same vein, I would also advocate that any Resident interested should place their name in nomination to join the Board of Directors by community vote in January. Your energy, engagement and acumen would be a welcome addition to the elected volunteer Board of our beautiful community - please consider it! Packets will be mailed soon.

Plans for the October 24 Halloween celebration are in the early stages and will be firmed up soon. The yearly budget for community activities will be reviewed in the near future. The upcoming Cars and Coffee event is expecting a good turnout and the organizer has some fun activities planned.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS –

Dock Proposals – Captain Rod's Docks contacted Anne Goebel regarding a proposal and that will be considered when it is received. It has been challenging to get other firms to respond. Mark Miller commented that something more might be needed at Beta Lake as well, such as a dock and/or a picnic table.

Benches Update – The bench plans are complete and Marlene is waiting for confirmations from residents who reached out to participate.

Engineering Firm Submissions – The three final firms being considered will give presentations at the Cheshire Clubhouse on Tuesday, September 15 starting at 12:00 p.m. Each firm will give their presentation to the Board, Nicki Leroy, Anne Goebel, and any residents in attendance while the remaining firms wait in the office building.

2026 Paving – The new paving contract with M&J Asphalt Paving has been signed and dates are being looked at for completion of projects at Bury Court, Heaton Court, North Buckingham parking areas, and Hanks Park lot.

Monument at Golfview and Route 56 – Dianne Hurrell met with a firm to take a closer look at the sign and the lights. Upon further inspection, the posts are sturdy but the sign itself is not and will need to be replaced. A double-sided aluminum sign with plastic covering that will hold up to weather damage is proposed. The electricity at the sign area is being checked as well to determine if it still works. Mike Douglas from Bliss Creek/Open Range has agreed to share the expenses and they will also remove the overgrown brush around the sign at their expense, while Prestbury will be responsible for replacing it. Dianne Hurrell motioned to approve moving forward with this sign update at a cost not to exceed \$5,000.00; Charles Bohmer seconded and the motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS –

Pool Proposals – Proposals are being considered for a new pool management company. Since there are two more weekends before the pool officially closes for the season, these proposals will be looked at in more depth at the October board meeting.

Mechanical Service Proposals – Premier Mechanical submitted a proposal totaling \$2,280 annually for two boiler maintenance visits, scheduled in the spring and fall. Sutfin Mechanical submitted a proposal totaling \$5,400 annually for two preventive maintenance visits. Both proposals exclude repairs, replacement parts, and additional work outside the stated maintenance scope. Premier Mechanical has prior knowledge of Prestbury's needs and good response times and Anne Goebel suggested that Premier is the better option. Laura Fulton motioned to approve an annual contract with Premier Mechanical at \$2,280.00; Dianne Hurrell seconded and the motion carried.

Bur Oak Proposals – Three areas are being addressed with Bur Oak: 1) Maintenance of the creek: Bur Oak proposed a cost of \$3,625.00 to remove debris from the creek area. Marlene Deck motioned to approve; Nick Edyvane seconded and the motion carried. 2) Replacements for two trees that were previously removed: Bur Oak proposed planting a Beech tree and a Coffee tree at a total cost of \$1,889.13. Marlene Deck motioned to approve; Dianne Hurrell seconded and the motion carried. 3) Removing debris and bamboo from the area outside of the pool fence and replacing with mulch while keeping the existing trees: Bur Oak quoted a cost of \$1,875.00 for this work. Charles Bohmer motioned to approve; Mark Miller seconded and the motion carried.

Scientific Aquatic Proposal – Work has been completed on the aerators in the lakes, including maintenance, balancing, cleaning, and part replacement at a total cost of \$1,900.00. Laura Fulton motioned to approve this expense; Charles Bohmer seconded and the motion carried. Prestbury is looking at a maintenance agreement to avoid unexpected future costs in this area and will discuss further at the October meeting.

Legal Representation – Prestbury's main point of contact at law firm Surrey and Costello has left the firm to go on their own. Marlene Deck spoke with Doug Surrey, one of the partners who has a long history with Prestbury. The Board discussed and agreed that, due to the history, Surrey and Costello's knowledge of Prestbury and prior good work done, as well as a very reasonable retainer, the community will stay with this relationship. Laura Fulton moved that Prestbury continue to retain Surrey and Costello as their legal representation; Nick Edyvane seconded and the motion carried. Mark Miller inquired as to the dollar amount of the contracts that Prestbury has reviewed by counsel. This amount is currently \$5,000.00 and above. Anne Goebel shared that the current firm agreed to unlimited review of contracts with the existing retainer and that they also provide an itemized summary of work done.

Luau RSVP/Deposit - The Luau was a very nice event, but was unfortunately underattended despite the fact that the RSVP limit was reached very quickly and some residents could not register due to the 100-person safety limit on the event. It is estimated that only 50-60 people attended of the 100 that RSVP'ed, resulting in extra food and lost revenue. The Board is discussing implementing a small fee with next year's registrations in order to offset costs in case residents who registered are not able to attend. This will be discussed further at a future meeting.

Blue Stem Proposals – Marlene Deck and Anne Goebel met with the representative from Blue Stem to discuss some of their recent work as well as future needs. 1) The island in Lake Prestbury: trimming the island two times per year is not enough to keep it looking well; a trimming three times per year was proposed at a total cost of \$2,600.00. Anne Goebel noted that future contracts will include the stipulation that any materials that are removed will be burned or hauled away the same day. Marlene Deck motioned to approve; Charles Bohmer seconded and the motion carried. 2) Dam spillway at Turtle Cove: The area needs to be cleaned up while considering erosion mitigation. Blue Stem has proposed costs of \$3,425.00 for clean up and \$1,715.00 for follow up treatments. Marlene Deck motioned to approve the total expense of \$5,140.00; Dianne Hurrell seconded and the motion carried.

Trailer/Generator/Pump for Kubota – In order to register the Kubota vehicle with the State of Illinois, proof is needed that the sales tax was paid. Prestbury is communicating with DuKane Equipment, the company that sold the vehicle to the community, to obtain this information. Additionally, Nicki Leroy contacted the Village of Sugar Grove and confirmed that with an identifying sign, yellow light, first aid kit and fire extinguisher, the vehicle should be road ready. There are some additional items needed to allow for the most efficient use of the vehicle by Prestbury maintenance. A trailer to carry the water tank is being considered at a cost range of \$600.00 - \$925.00. Filling the tank has been a challenge as there is no water pressure with the tank. Anne Goebel proposes that a water pump be added for next year at an estimated cost of \$489.00. Mark Miller voiced concerns that there seem to be too many additional costs for a new vehicle that was already expensive for the community. The board discussed whether the vendor should have alerted Prestbury to some of the potential additional requirements and their costs at the time of purchase. The board agreed to table the full discussion for now until the board member who works with DuKane can make inquiries. In the meantime, the board generally agreed that the trailer and water pump are necessary and will curb overall maintenance costs in the long run. Dianne Hurrell motioned that Prestbury go ahead with the trailer and water pump at a total cost not to exceed \$1,500.00; Charles Bohmer seconded; Mark Miller opposed but the motion carried with a majority vote.

Illinois Law regarding e-Bikes – A new Illinois law takes effect in January 2027 in regard to use of e-Bikes. As this has been a growing safety concern in Prestbury, the board would like the community to be aware of the pending law. Blackberry Lake Common Parking – The board further discussed the issue that was addressed at the beginning of the meeting regarding parking at Blackberry Lake. Several possibilities are being considered, including a fence and locked chain, as well potentially adding an additional boat pad at this lake, near Hardwick Court. The locked chain option would present some challenges when the boat launch there is needed. The board will visit and look at this area and discuss options at a future meeting.

Year End Timeline – Laura Fulton reminded board members to review their budgets for 2027 and shared that Prestbury would like to hold homeowner association dues steady for residents next year if at all possible.

RECESS TO EXECUTIVE SESSION – At 8:09 p.m. Laura Fulton moved to close the meeting and move to Executive Session; Dianne Hurrell seconded and the meeting was adjourned. Executive Session was held.

ADJOURNMENT OF EXECUTIVE SESSION – At 9:03 p.m. Laura Fulton moved to close the executive meeting and return to open session. Charles Bohmer seconded the motion carried.

ADJOURNMENT OF MEETING – 9:04 p.m. Laura Fulton moved to adjourn the meeting. Charles Bohmer seconded the motion carried.

The next board meeting is October 13, 2026 at the PCA Office building.
