PRESTBURY VANDALISM - Recently there have been reported acts of vandalism in the neighborhood and parks. Early in September the gate to tennis courts had the wire pried back to allow the ability to reach inside and open the gate and this week the baby swings in Winthrop New Park had the chains on one side disconnected making them unusable. If you observe strange activity in the area please send a note to the office so we can alert the proper authorities and/or contact the Kane County Sheriff Office directly.

COMMUNITY COMMENTS – The hearing of community comments began at 6:30PM on September 8th, 2020 via virtual meeting due to COVID-19 gathering restrictions. 10 residents called into the meeting.

CALL TO ORDER – President Frank Gerry called the September 8th, 2020 Prestbury Citizens Association (PCA) board meeting to order at 6:41 p.m. after a brief conversation with the community residents. Directors present were: Tom Brewer, Kathy BuzECKy, John Osterman, George Hauser, Tim Kanive, Doug Raskosky, Lindsay Yates and Mike Krzus. Jeanette Catellier, from Associa Chicagoland, was also in attendance.

A motion was made by George Hauser and seconded by John Osterman to approve the September 8th, 2020 agenda, with the modification of moving the Treasurer's Report to be the first item of discussion. The motion carried.

PRESIDENT REPORT –

PCA COMMUNITY OPERATIONAL UPDATE

When Illinois Region 4 was elevated to Phase 4 back on June 26, PCA was able to open the Cheshire Club, the Prestbury office, the PCA Community pool (within Pool Specific IDPH Guidelines), basketball courts, park equipment and the playgrounds all with specific safe distancing and related requirements. A common thread throughout opening facilities where people can congregate is a group size limit of no more than 50 people. As previously announced, our PCA community open area and hiking trails remain available for outdoor recreation such as walking, hiking and activities that can be undertaken at a safe social

distance. PCA has been diligent in following the state guidelines to ensure compliance and will continue to do so throughout 2020.

POOL

As of Labor Day September 7, the PCA pool operations completed its 2020 season. The Board would like to thank the residents and guests for all their cooperation as we navigated the Covid related compliance requirements from the Illinois DPH. All operations have gone reasonably well, with the minor exceptions of some policy compliance issues and some lack of familiarity with the pool slot reservation system. Our focus now becomes planning for 2021 and what type of enhancements and upgrades we may be able to implement.

DAM

As many of you have probably noticed, the PCA dam modification project has moved to completion. There were some minor regrading work that had to be completed to meet IDNR specifications. That work was completed on Sept 4. Completion was expected by end September and actually finished up a few weeks early. Project is likely to finish under the \$ 1.3 M total budget. We certainly appreciated the community's patience throughout the project.

SAFETY IN THE COMMUNITY

As we move through this 2020 summer season and into the fall, we expect families, families with small children and adults to continue to spend more time at home here in Prestbury due to the effects of the pandemic and other issues. Please be extra vigilant and try to make Prestbury as safe and people friendly as possible:

- Keep an eye on children playing in the community. For parents, please encourage the use of the sidewalks, not playing in the street.
- Drivers - please be extra cautious for this reason and keep the speed down

2021 PCA BUDGET

The Board is actively reviewing future PCA community needs, both reserve and operations related, to develop the 2021 PCA budget for the community. Our goal is to work through our financial plan during September and early October such that we can have a planned 2021 Budget ready for Board review and approval at the November meeting.

COMMUNICATIONS

Our PCA board assistant, Nicki Leroy, has returned to the PCA office and normal work hours. She is available via phone (630-466-1576) and a new email (pcaoffice@prestbury.org) to handle all normal PCA business. We also plan on continuing virtual monthly meetings for PCA through at least the September meeting.

MAINTENANCE – Lakes - Common Areas

COMMON AREAS

Mailbox and fence repair and maintenance are continuing.

Final landscaping of the dam improvement area is underway and an erosion area on the southeast corner of Lake Prestbury has been repaired as part of this.

The canopy of a line of trees in front of Hankes Road Park has been raised. The canopy of a line of trees near the site of the dam work area has been raised.

One hundred and ten trees have been trimmed along Golf View Road that had been slapping some of the larger vehicles that use the road.

A line of evergreen trees that were infringing on the walkway area between Winthrop New Park and Swanbrooke have been trimmed back for better access to the footpath.

The signs that were removed to do the work on the dam will soon be replaced.

**PARKS / TRAILS / TENNIS COURTS –
PLAYGROUND and PARK UPDATE**

The upgrade of the Winthrop New Park is underway with work to begin in the next few weeks. The park will totally be redone with new equipment, poured rubber flooring and a shelter added with picnic tables. Plans are being reviewed to upgrade the Hanks Park next spring if budget monies allow.

TRAILS

The wooded trail between New Bond Street and N. Buckingham Dr will have the bridge replaced in late September as soon as the parts are received. The new crossing will extend across the marsh area for a total length of 120 feet. This should eliminate the wet muddy area around each end of the bridge and make for safer walking. As soon as the work is scheduled signs will be posted to alert all of the potential danger during construction. Please help us keep this area closed during the construction.

TENNIS COURTS

The tennis courts will be closed for a few days the week of Sept 8th to repair splits and paint in the surface and remove the blue pickleball markings. Plans are for the work to be completed by the end of the week. Please remain off the courts during this time to allow the contractor full access to the courts. As soon as the work is completed all will be notified.

Over the last few weeks there have been instances where the gate to the courts has been propped open with rocks, Please do not prop the gate open. If you contact the office they will provide the combination to you. Thanks for helping protect and maintain the courts for all to enjoy.

Additional information: The tennis court repairs will be delayed due to the weather. The repairs will start as soon as the weather permits.

STREETS, DRAINAGE and STREET LIGHTS -

The planned road resurfacing project for 2020 has been completed. No other work is planned for the year. J&J, PCA's contractor, completed the job in a timely manner and came in under budget.

Benefits of our transition to LED illumination for PCA streetlights have been noticeable. The maintenance frequency for bulb replacement has dropped significantly along with the immediate reduction of wattage demand. Maintenance costs so far in 2020 is under \$ 500 again the spend of several thousand dollars in 2019. This reduction will markedly improve payback for the 2019 LED investment.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS –

Lake Prestbury Dam Update – The project is close to being done. Additional grading was required the week of August 31st, but was completed by Friday, September 4th. Final items of payment, inspections, and a final review by the IDNR are still needed.

Long Range Plan - A 25-year Long Range Plan, originating in 2017, has been circulated to the board for feedback. A request was made to provide Nicki Leroy with feedback prior to the October board meeting.

2021 Budget - A request was made by Doug Raskosky to provide 2021 committee budgets as soon as possible, to allow for discussion by the board at the October board meeting.

NEW BUSINESS –

Bur Oak Holiday Decoration Proposal - Bur Oak offered several proposals for various holiday decoration packages. A motion was made by George Hauser, and seconded by Tim Kanive, to approve the proposal for the package totalling \$3,969.20, which includes community holiday decorations throughout the Prestbury community and the labor to put them up. Motion carried.

Lakes Prestbury and Blackberry Fish Re-Stock Order - Re-stocking of the fish in PCA lakes will be made in accordance with recommendations from the company that performed our fish survey last May. The needed re-stocking is not due to any effects of the dam update, but rather an expected and planned re-stock to fill in gaps of species and age groups. Species re-stocked will be of various sized Largemouth Bass, Bluegill and Channel Catfish. A motion was made by

George Hauser, seconded by Tim Kanive to approve the restocking in the amount of not more than \$ 3,300. Motion carried.

Pizzo 2021 Budget Proposals - Three proposals were received from Pizzo for PCA land care. A motion was made by George Hauser, seconded by Lindsay Yates, to accept a 3 year contract, with the ability for PCA to opt out annually, in the amount of \$20,960 for year 1, \$20,960 for year 2, and \$26,460 for year 3 due to a prescribed burn. Motion carried.

Halloween Parade - A decision was made by the board, initiated by Lindsay Yates, to schedule a social distanced Halloween parade for Sunday, October 25th, at 2PM. There will be no rain date. More details will come closer to the date.

EXECUTIVE SESSION - A motion was made by Tim Kanive and seconded by George Hauser to move to executive session at 7:12PM. The motion carried.

A motion was made by George Hauser and seconded by Lindsay Yates to return from executive session at 7:48PM. The motion carried.

ADJOURN - A motion was made by John Osterman and seconded by Tom Brewer to adjourn the September 8th, 2020 meeting at 7:48PM. Motion carried.

The next meeting of the PCA Board of Directors will be Tuesday, October 13th, 2020 at 6:30PM. The platform will be determined and distributed closer to the meeting date.

PCA RULES AND IMPORTANT INFORMATION

BOATS - Boat registration was due by June 1st, at a cost of \$10.00 per year. After June 2nd, the cost goes up to \$25.00 per year. Replacement stickers are available at the time of registration if you are unable to read the numbers or it has been removed from your boat.

POOL – Pool ID pass photos are available at the PCA office between the hours of 8:30 A.M and 2:30 P.M. Monday – Friday

Hours 11:00am – 8:00pm Weather Permitting. Weather Policy is as follows; Thunder or Lightning is heard or seen 30 minutes everyone out of the pool. 30 minutes restarts if additional Thunder or Lightning is encountered. Notice has been posted in the display board outside of the pool entrance.

The air temperature must be at least 68 degrees to open.

Any resident who does not have a pool ID card and wants to use the pool will need to come in to the PCA Office to have one taken. Please remember, proof of residency is required.

Children that have turned 5 this past year will need to have a photo Identity pass made.

Children who will turn 11 years old by July 1st will need to have a new picture ID pass taken.

If you received a temporary card without your picture on it or require a replacement card, please see Nicki in the PCA office.

Passes must be with residents at all times. Passes must be presented before entering pool. No Entry without a Prestbury issued Identity pass. No Excuses will be accepted. Strict Rules apply.

LOT MAINTENANCE - Visual character and economic value of property in a neighborhood are affected by the quality of building and grounds maintenance. All owners shall keep all lots and premises owned by them, and all improvements therein or thereon, in good order and repair as determined by the PCA Board.

Property owners and residents are responsible for properly maintaining the exterior of their residence, as well as fences, decks, and other structures on their lots. Required maintenance includes those actions necessary to preserve the appearance of the property and prevent deterioration. Materials that have deteriorated must be repaired or replaced. Examples of deterioration include, but are not limited to: peeling, fading, or chalking paint; siding or trim (including shutters, fascia, and flashing) that is severely faded, mismatched, broken, rotted,

dirty, or dented; missing gutters or downspouts that are bent, sagging, or missing; and approved fencing that is broken, rotted, leaning, or missing.

Lawns must be maintained in a manner that is in keeping with the ambience of Prestbury. Turf, including that on undeveloped lots, must be mowed before it exceeds 6" in height. Planting beds, shrubbery, driveways, and walkways must be properly maintained. Dead or dying trees and downed branches must be removed within 30 days, as outlined in the "Enforcement of Rules and Regulations."

Grass clippings and yard waste must be placed in appropriate brown paper bags. No sticker is required.

Brush & tree trimmings must be bundled and securely tied with twine or string not to exceed 4 feet in length, 2 feet in diameter and 50 pounds in weight. Individual branches contained in any bundle shall not exceed 4 inches in diameter.

All rubbish, trash or garbage shall be kept so as not to be seen from neighboring dwellings and streets, and protected from animals, or kept in the garage.

Neither garbage nor yard waste may be placed on curbs prior to 5:00 p.m. on the evening preceding the day of garbage pick-up.

No Personal Garbage should be tossed out in the park garbage cans.

Residents who pay for trash pickup with their assessments, please contact the PCA Office if you will need to Dispose of large items.

Yard Waste Pick up runs from the first Wednesday in April through the last Wednesday November.

PARKING AND VEHICULAR RESTRICTIONS - Residents should make every effort to park their personal vehicles within their garage or on their driveway. Residents or their guests may use off-street parking areas for no longer than 48 consecutive hours. Residents or guests wishing to use off-street parking areas for longer than 48 consecutive hours must obtain permission from the PCA. Overnight parking (1:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m.) on any street (including cul-de-sacs) within Prestbury is prohibited.

LEASES, TENANTS, AND NON-RESIDENT UNIT OWNERS - All unit owners who do not reside in a unit owned by them shall provide the Association within 10 days of their departure, their permanent residence address and phone numbers where they may be reached in an emergency, both at home and at work. Any expense of the Board incurred locating a unit owner who fails to provide such information shall be charged back as a fine to that unit owner. Unless otherwise provided by law, any unit owner who fails to provide such information shall be deemed to have waived the right to receive notices at any address other than the address of the unit, and the Board shall not be liable for any loss, damage, injury, or prejudice to the rights of any such unit owner caused by any delays in receiving any notice.

Any lease relating to a unit must be in writing, and all tenants shall be subject to all the terms, conditions, and requirements of the Prestbury Rules and Regulations and By-laws of the Prestbury Citizens Association.

The unit owner, who enters into a lease of his or her unit, is responsible for providing the information regarding the tenant to the Association. Contact the PCA office with any questions or concerns.

ARCHITECTURAL STANDARDS – The Association has a complete set of Architectural Standards that must be adhered to for construction of new homes; remodeling of, or additions to, existing homes; any alteration of site drainage; or erection of any structure on the member's premises. The latter includes, but is not limited to, skateboard ramps, ice rinks, batting cages, tree houses, tree carvings, patios, decks, sunrooms, fences, and awnings as determined by the committee. Residents contemplating any of the above should request a set of Standards from the Prestbury Board Assistant and schedule a time to meet the Architectural Review committee prior to beginning any of the above actions. Residents of Sub-Associations may have their own set of Architectural Standards that must comply with PCA's standards, but their standards may be more restrictive. Further, The Prestbury Architectural Review committee shall have the right to review all such plans and specifications and to accept the same or reject the same if, in the opinion of the committee, they are not suitable or desirable for aesthetic compatible or any other reasons as set forth within the standards as proscribed by the Committee or the Board of Prestbury. The Architectural Review Committee may or may not within its own purview request any applicant to seek input from residents residing contiguously to any site involved in any request for approval and the committee reserves the right to define and proscribe for the site location of any such request. Such plans, specifications, and request shall either be approved, disapproved or amended in accordance to the guidance provided by the Architectural Review Committee, Architectural Standard and any proscribed governing documents. The Architectural Review Committee may also take into consideration such additional issues as exterior appearance, consistency with existing neighboring structures, size, and proposed location.

TENNIS COURT - To receive the code for the 2020 season, please, contact the PCA office by stopping in during Monday thru Friday 8:30am – 2:30pm or by calling 630-466-1576 or emailing pcaoffice@prestbury.org. Please have your Prestbury Photo ID number available to receive the new access code. If you do not have an ID, please come into the office to receive one. Please provide Proof of residency.

CHESHIRE CLUBHOUSE - Party dates to be canceled must be called in or e-mailed to the PCA Office immediately to open up the dates for other residents.

STREET LIGHTS - outages should be reported to the PCA Office to the PCA office

MUSKRAT SIGHTINGS - report to the PCA Office with locations and photos if possible.

Assessment payments / Dues are not accepted in the PCA office or PCA mail box.

PETS/ANIMAL CONTROL

No livestock (including poultry), horses, or more than two each of dogs or cats four months of age or older shall be kept or maintained on any lot or in any dwelling unit.

Dogs and cats must be contained on the owner's premises or on a leash in other areas. Residents walking pets on public streets or in common areas must clean up after their pets immediately and shall provide appropriate equipment for doing so (e.g., plastic bag and/or shovel). Pets are to be kept off private property, including empty lots.

In accordance with Kane County animal control ordinances, every owner of a dog or cat four months of age or older must register that dog or cat with the county animal control department within 30 days after having that dog or cat inoculated against rabies, as required by law. Every owner of a dog or cat three months of age or older shall cause such dog or cat to be inoculated against rabies by a licensed veterinarian at such intervals as have been established by the Illinois Department of Agriculture.

When pets are found roaming within Prestbury, every effort will be made to identify their owners. If the pet's owner cannot be identified, Kane County authorities will be notified and the pet will be impounded to be retrieved by, and at the expense of, its owner.

If you are a pet owner, thank you for your compliance as strict enforcement will be undertaken
